

or those who enjoy cruising amongst beautiful coastal scenery, swimming in clear blue waters and exploring little-known fishing ports and ancient towns with a small group of like-minded travellers, this seven night journey along the Croatian coast, visiting some idyllic islands along the way will surely appeal. Whilst Croatia itself is no longer a secret, Dalmatia offers a great concentration of the country's highlights and this unique cruise steers clear of the well-trodden tourist trail. As we journey through the intense blue sea of the Adriatic between the Medieval walled city of Dubrovnik and the historic city of Split with its Diocletian Palace built by the Romans, we will head to some of the quieter spots and out-of-the-way beaches and islands which the Croats themselves escape to; places where you can wander the streets away from crowds and where nightlife means a nightcap by the harbour.

We will discover some of Croatia's natural beauty on the island of Mljet where we will tour the National Park including its beautiful lakes. We will spend time on the island of Korcula where the Old Town with its wonderful Medieval atmosphere and charming waterfront restaurants can be enjoyed during our overnight mooring. We also visit some of the quieter islands and ports along the Dalmatian coast, with plenty of opportunities for swims in secluded bays and from some pristine beaches. Discover Jelsa on the island of Hvar, surrounded by pine forests, Bol on the island of Brac which is close to the stunning Zlatni rat beach and tranquil Maslinica, an idyllic spot with just 208 inhabitants.

With just 36 guests on board we will be able to explore parts of the coast that most cruise ship passengers in the region rarely get to visit and, taking advantage of our central and overnight moorings, you will be able to sample the wonderful gastronomy and experience the enchanting towns and harbours in their evening splendour. In addition to our included, guided excursions, we have allowed ample time at leisure and there will also be opportunities to swim from the ship as we call into secluded bays and hidden coves.









Dubrovnik to Split Itinerary – 18th to 25th June 2027

Day 1 London to Dubrovnik, Croatia. Fly by scheduled flight. On arrival transfer to the Queen Eleganza. Enjoy a welcome dinner on board this evening as we moor overnight. **(D)**

Day 2 Dubrovnik & Mljet. Spend the morning in Dubrovnik, the "Pearl of the Adriatic". After a short drive to Pile Gate, we will begin our guided walk through the unique Medieval Old Town of Dubrovnik, which was added to the UNESCO World Heritage List in 1979. See the major attractions such as the Rector's Palace, the Romanesque-Gothic Dominican and Franciscan Monasteries and the Sponza Palace. Return to the vessel for lunch as we set sail to Mljet. There will be the opportunity to dine ashore this evening as we moor overnight. (B, L)

Day 3 Mljet & Korcula. Mljet is one of the few Dalmatian islands that was never ruled by Venice and this is apparent in the architecture and the absence of any sizeable historic town. What it lacks in great architecture it more than makes up for in natural beauty and there will be a tour to the National Park including its beautiful lakes. Over lunch we sail to Korcula, the reputed birthplace of the explorer Marco Polo, arriving later this afternoon. On a walking tour enjoy some time to walk along the crooked Medieval streets to the elegant squares which are flanked with palaces of the old nobility. We will moor overnight and you will be able to dine ashore in the Old Town this evening. (B, L)

Day 4 Korcula & Makarska. We depart this morning for a leisurely sail along the coast and will find a peaceful cove to stop for a swim in the crystal clear waters of the Adriatic before lunch. Continue to Makarska, a charming harbour town on the Croatian mainland with a stunning mountain backdrop where we will arrive this afternoon. Enjoy dinner on board this evening. We will moor overnight allowing the opportunity for an evening walk along the beautiful palm-fringed promenade. (B, L, D)

Day 5 Jelsa, Hvar. After a morning sailing, we will arrive on the island of Hvar after lunch, mooring in the picturesque town of Jelsa. This small harbour town is surrounded by pine forests and is the perfect place for an afternoon stroll or maybe take a walk to one of the nearby beaches that can be found in the secluded coves that dot the coastline. Dine ashore this evening in one of the many harbourside restaurants and moor overnight. (B, L)

Day 6 Bol, Brac & Maslinica, Solta. Over breakfast we will make the short sail over to the island of Brac where we will moor in the small town of Bol.

Spend some time exploring this attractive old town, or head to one of the nearby beaches for a swim, including Zlatni rat, arguably one of the most beautiful beaches in Croatia. Return to the ship for lunch as we sail on to the island of Solta, where we berth in the small village of Maslinica. This tranquil spot, home to just 208 inhabitants, is well off the beaten track and is an idyllic spot for a late afternoon wander or a swim. Enjoy dinner on board as we moor overnight. (B, L, D)

Day 7 Maslinica & Split. There will be the opportunity for another swim this morning before we sail over lunch to our final port of call, Split. Upon arrival take a guided walk through the city which includes the Palace of Diocletian which was built by the emperor in 295-305 AD as his retirement villa. Much of this large building is well preserved and the palace contains Split's Old Town within its walls, making it the only Roman palace that has been continuously inhabited since Roman times. This evening enjoy our farewell dinner on board. (B, L, D)

Day 8 Split to London. Disembark this morning and transfer to the airport for our scheduled flight to London. (B)









Split to Dubrovnik Itinerary – 25th June to 2nd July & 6th to 13th September 2027

Day 1 London to Split, Croatia. Fly by scheduled flight. On arrival transfer to the Queen Eleganza. Enjoy a welcome dinner on board this evening as we moor overnight. (D)

Day 2 Split & Maslinica. This morning take a guided walk through the city which includes the Palace of Diocletian which was built by the emperor in 295-305 AD as his retirement villa. Dine ashore this evening in one of the many harbourside restaurants and moor overnight. (B, L)

Day 4 Jelsa & Makarska. Spend this morning in Jelsa, maybe take a walk to one of the nearby beaches that can be found in the secluded coves that dot the coastline. Over lunch we sail to Makarska on the Croatian mainland. This afternoon is free to explore this charming spot with its palm fringed promenade and stunning mountain backdrop. Enjoy dinner on board this evening and moor overnight. (B, L, D)

Day 5 Korcula. We depart this morning for a leisurely sail along the coast and will find a peaceful cove to stop for a swim in the crystal clear waters of the Adriatic before lunch. Continue to Korcula, the reputed birthplace of the explorer Marco Polo, arriving later this afternoon. 


Your Cabin

The 18 cabins are attractively designed with neutral décor and stylish furnishings. There are six different grades of cabin arranged over two decks; all cabins feature either portholes (all lower deck cabins), small windows (categories 3 & 5) or picture windows (categories 2 & 4) and are spacious with a well-designed layout, comfortable seating and all the mod cons. The cabins range in size from 13 square metres for the category 2 cabin to 25 square metres for the category 5 cabin. Facilities include air conditioning/heating, wardrobe, drawers and spacious under bed storage, television, hairdryer and safety deposit box. Each cabin also has an en-suite bathroom with a shower, a large sink with under sink drawer space and toiletries including shower gel, soap, shampoo and conditioner. All bathrooms feature a small window.

If you prefer a peaceful life at sea and a casual, laid-back ambience then you need look no further than the Queen Eleganza. The vessel has been designed with spacious outside public areas including a large Sun Deck with an excellent shaded area and a Jacuzzi. 
Your Dining
