



We begin in St Petersburg, one of the world's most beautiful cities and cruise to Moscow, a city full of contrasts and energy. Whilst cruising between Russia's two greatest cities we will travel through quieter rural landscapes and also visit unique Uglich, Yaroslavl and Kizhi.

We have arranged for some memorable excursions for our journey along the Volga including specially arranged early entrances to the Hermitage and the Armoury Museum at the Kremlin and to further enhance the journey we will be accompanied by London Festival Opera who will perform a selection of wonderful Russian repertoires. Our Guest Speaker, Ludmilla Selezneva will complete the experience with fascinating talks on all things Russian, especially its history and peoples.



With such a wealth of the arts, history and architecture, a journey to Russia can be a challenge to plan. However the beauty of this trip is that over the course of only 13 days you will have gained a vast amount of knowledge in the most comfortable means possible. The shore excursions, talks by Ludmilla and music performances by London Festival Opera will provide a unique insight into Russian life, past and present, and altogether makes for an unforgettable trip.

Professor Ludmilla Selezneva is a graduate with honours from Rostov State University and received her first doctorate there in history in 1982. She attained her second doctorate in 1996 from the Russian State University of Humanities in Moscow. Since 2001, Ludmilla has worked as a professor of history and politics at the University of the Humanitarian Education in Moscow. She has published more than 50 articles and authored or co-authored 10 books. She is a well-recognised authority on 20th century Russia, the Russian political movements and parties, and the modern political history.

London Festival Opera



We are delighted to be joined by London Festival Opera who bring together artists from the major British opera companies including the Royal Opera House, English National Opera and Glyndebourne Festival Opera. The company has a considerable reputation and has appeared in some of the world's leading opera houses. Artistic Director, Philip Blake-Jones will provide a comprehensive programme during our time sailing and whilst moored, the repertoire planned being:-

- *Soirée d'Opéra* – featuring the operas of Mozart, Verdi, Tchaikovsky, Saint-Saëns and Bizet
- *'Opera Gala'* – with arias and ensembles from the works of Verdi, Offenbach, Tchaikovsky and Puccini
- *'Russian Gala'* – featuring highlights from Tchaikovsky's *'Eugene Onegin'* and songs by Rachmaninov and Shostakovich. The artists will appear in costume for this performance
- *'Farewell Opera Gala'* – featuring the works of Mozart, Donizetti, Verdi, Tchaikovsky and Rachmaninov

The Itinerary

Day 1 London to St Petersburg, Russia. Fly by scheduled flight. On arrival, transfer to the MS Volga Dream and embark. Meet your fellow travellers this evening at the Welcome Drinks & Dinner on board.

Day 2 St Petersburg. Begin today at the meticulously restored Peterhof, St Petersburg's most famous and spectacular Imperial estate, often cited as the "Versailles of Russia". Visit Bath Cottage and stroll in the vast Lower Park with its 176 fountains of various forms and styles, four cascades, and numerous gilded statues of ancient gods and heroes. Afterwards, return to St. Petersburg by hydrofoil where we will enjoy lunch in a local restaurant. This afternoon we will visit the wonderful Fabergé Museum at Shuvalov Palace. This beautiful museum contains the world's largest collection of works by Carl Fabergé, including nine of the famous Imperial Easter Eggs, regarded not only as the finest jewelled works of art, but also as unique historical artifacts. The museum's collection also includes decorative and applied works made by the Russian masters of the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Return to the MS Volga Dream for dinner which will be followed with a performance by London Festival Opera on board.

Day 3 St Petersburg. This morning we visit the famed Hermitage Museum, where we have an early entrance allowing us to enjoy the masterpieces away from the crowds. This former residence of the Russian Tsars has 400 rooms and contains spectacular examples of nearly all schools of Western art. Proceed to the Gold rooms of the Hermitage (closed to the general public), to see the amazing collection of Scythian gold and Tsarist jewellery. Lunch in a local restaurant will be followed by a relaxing ceremonial canal cruise, offering fantastic views of St Petersburg's greatest landmarks, including the Peter and Paul Fortress, the Winter Palace and the Old Stock Exchange on Vasilyevsky Island, as well as St. Isaac's Cathedral and the Admiralty. Return to the ship for an evening on board, or for those who pre-book, there will be a musical evening ashore at the Mariinsky Theatre or similar (subject to schedules and availability).

Day 4 St Petersburg. This morning drive to Tsar's Village for a visit to Catherine's Palace. See the exquisitely restored Amber Room and stroll in the formal gardens. After lunch in a local restaurant we will visit the magnificent Yusupov Palace, once the residence of the wealthiest and most respected family in Imperial Russia, which saw one of the most dramatic episodes in Russia's history – the murder of Grigori Rasputin. Return to the MS Volga Dream this evening and set sail.

Day 5 Mandrogi & the Svir River. This morning we will step ashore for a brief visit to the vacation village of Mandrogi to experience daily life in a quaint wooden village. Continue cruising as we navigate the Svir River towards Lake

Ladoga, Europe's largest freshwater lake, past a shoreline dotted with graceful willows, alder trees and stately pines. This afternoon enjoy a second performance by London Festival Opera.

Day 6 Kizhi. Today we explore the tiny, picturesque island of Kizhi, a UNESCO World Heritage Site on Lake Onega. The open-air Museum of Architecture includes the Church of the Transfiguration, a unique onion-domed masterpiece built without a single metal nail and resembling something out of a Russian fairy tale.

Day 7 Goritsy. Today we cross Lake Belye, or the White Lake, formerly known as the "Tsar's fishing grounds". Arrive in the peaceful village of Goritsy to tour the fortress-like Kirillov-Belozersky Monastery with magnificent frescoes by one of Russia's most renowned icon painters.

Day 8 Yaroslavl. This morning we will be in Yaroslavl, the oldest city on the Volga River and a World Heritage Site. We will visit the Church of St. Elijah the Prophet with its detailed frescoes and icons and will be treated to a stirring à Capella choir performance. Afterwards there will be time to experience the lively farm market before re-boarding the MS Volga Dream. Alternatively, join an excursion to the Governor's Palace, a living museum of Russian art, history and culture. Evening on board with a performance by London Festival Opera.

Day 9 Uglich. We arrive this afternoon in Uglich which dates back to the 10th century. A walking tour of this Golden Ring city includes the Chapel of Dimitry, a 17th century treasure built on the site where Ivan the Terrible's 10 year old son met his death. Visit the Church of the Transfiguration, noted for its beautiful iconostasis, and attend a concert of choral music.

Day 10 Moscow. We arrive into Moscow mid-morning and after an early lunch on board, depart for a tour to see Red Square, with its iconic St Basil's Cathedral and GUM department store. We continue on to visit the Old Tretyakov gallery to view its extraordinary collection of Russian art, ranging from 12th century icons to 20th century paintings.

Day 11 Moscow. This morning we depart for an early visit to the Kremlin to see the Armoury Museum, with its collection of Tsarist thrones, ceremonial crowns, coaches and gifts of state. View the ornate gems of the Diamond Fund, including Catherine the Great's diamond-encrusted coronation crown and the 190 carat Orlov diamond. Also visit the Square of Three Cathedrals (with entrance to one Cathedral). After lunch in a local restaurant, the afternoon will be at leisure or you may wish to

join the optional guided tour of the Moscow Metro, where you can experience some of the most beautiful stations in the world. This evening for those who pre-book there will be an evening of music ashore at the Bolshoi Theatre or similar (*subject to schedules and ticket availability*).

Day 12 Moscow. This morning we take a trip to see the Cathedral of Christ the Saviour and the fascinating Novodevichy Cemetery. The cemetery holds the tombs of notable Russian authors, musicians, playwrights, and poets, as well as political leaders and scientists. After lunch in a local restaurant we will visit the Pushkin Museum, the largest museum of European art in Moscow and home to top works by Van Gogh, Gauguin, Picasso and Matisse. Return to the MS Volga Dream and this evening enjoy your Farewell Dinner on board followed by a final highlight performance by London Festival Opera.

Day 13 Moscow to London. Disembark after breakfast and transfer to the airport for your return scheduled flight to London.

MS VOLGA DREAM

The vast network of Russian waterways is served by numerous standard class vessels. However for our journey along the Volga we are fortunate to be using the deluxe MS Volga Dream. This elegant vessel has been totally rebuilt from a vessel that originally accommodated over 200 passengers and now accommodates just 100. The result is a splendid and spacious vessel that offers superior accommodation and services.

Your Cabin

Cabins are located over four decks and categories range from standard cabins on the Cabin Deck to deluxe suites on the Sun Deck. All cabins are outside facing with Standard staterooms on the Cabin Deck featuring porthole windows, Main and Promenade Deck cabins feature large picture windows, except for the Owner's suite located on the Promenade Deck which has both large picture windows and a private wrap around terrace. All cabins and suites on the Sun Deck feature picture windows. All cabins offer individually controlled air-conditioning and heating, direct dial telephone, satellite flat screen television and minibar. Additional comforts provided include bathrobes, slippers, hairdryer, bathroom accessories kit, bottled water (replenished daily) and a welcome fruit basket.

Your Space

Spread over four decks, the MS Volga Dream is spacious and tastefully decorated to look more like a country hotel than a river vessel. The restaurant is located on the Main Deck and accommodates all guests in one sitting. The Neva Lounge and Bar is a pleasant space for relaxation with large panoramic windows and a bar area where music is performed live. On the large, spacious Sun Deck you will find comfortable deck furniture where you can relax and take in the passing Russian countryside. There is also a library which features board games and internet access, a fitness centre, sauna and boutique.

Your Dining

The stylish restaurant is located on the Main Deck and seats all passengers in one sitting at tables of four, six and eight. In keeping with the superior quality of the vessel, the cuisine aboard the MS Volga Dream is what you would expect aboard a luxurious river vessel and both Russian and international cuisine is served. Breakfast is served buffet style with both continental and cooked meal options, and lunch is served buffet-style, with an a la carte option for your main course. When weather permits guests are welcome to enjoy their meals on the Sun Deck. Dinner is served a la carte and is a four course affair, including some specialist themed evenings which will feature national delicacies. Afternoon tea is served daily in the lounge and there is a coffee and tea station operating 24 hours a day.



Life On Board

With just 100 fellow passengers and 60 crew members, the MS Volga Dream prides itself in its personal and friendly ambiance. Although the atmosphere aboard is informal, the comfort and service is akin to a deluxe hotel, otherwise not available in remote rural areas of Russia. Your daily programme will be busy ashore, but your time on board will be relaxed and convivial. In addition to shore excursions there will be daily activities aboard the vessel for your enjoyment, such as Russian language classes, matryoshka painting classes, Russian cooking classes and if the weather permits a barbecue on the Sun Deck.

For your Comfort, Safety and Security

The MS Volga Dream's dedicated crew of 60 is there to ensure that your journey along Russia's iconic river is comfortable, informative and above all safe. The ship is not designed for those with severe mobility restrictions or wheelchair dependent passengers as there is no lift on board. There is a full time doctor on board in the unlikely case of an emergency or a passenger seeking medical attention. Smoking on board is restricted to a specially designed area on the Sun Deck.
