For our French river cruises in 2018 we are delighted to have chartered the elegant Amadeus Provence. Due to be launched in April 2017, she accommodates a maximum of 140 passengers and offers modern and spacious public areas and comfortable, well-appointed cabins. Joining you on board will be a Noble Caledonia team including a Cruise Director, Tour Manager and Guest Speaker.

Your Cabin/Suite

The accommodation on board is arranged over three of the vessel's four decks and all cabins are outside facing. Cabins feature an en-suite bathroom and are fitted with individual climate control, flat screen television, direct dial telephone, safe, generous closet space and a choice of bed configuration. Cabins measure 17.5m² and those on the Mozart and Strauss Deck feature floor to ceiling glass doors which have an automatic drop-down system that can be opened half way. Cabins on the Haydn Deck have smaller panoramic windows that cannot be opened. The eight suites measure 26.4m² and feature a mini-bar and walk out exterior balcony.

Your Space

Full of elegance and charm, the vessel offers plenty of space to unwind and watch the world go by. Spread over four decks, the ship's public spaces include the stylish restaurant which accommodates all guests in one sitting. The Panorama Bar and Lounge is an excellent area for relaxation and socialising with your fellow travellers. The vessel also features a gift shop, massage room, hair salon, fitness room and a lift services the Haydn, Strauss and Mozart Decks. There is a spacious Sun Deck with comfortable deck furniture and an outdoor swimming pool which is the perfect place to relax and appreciate the passing scenery.






Your Dining



Enclosed by Medieval walls, this great City of the Popes boasts a number of splendid museums, churches and palaces and from Viviers we will visit the dramatic Ardeche Gorges.

THE ITINERARY

Day 1 London to Lyon, France.

Fly by scheduled flight or travel by train from London St Pancras. Upon arrival, transfer to the Amadeus Provence and embark. Meet our fellow travellers this evening during Welcome Drinks and Dinner.

Day 2 Vienne.

Sail this morning to Vienne. After lunch, we will spend the afternoon in the fine Roman town of Vienne, beautifully located in the Rhone Valley and surrounded by hills. On a guided walking tour, learn about its Roman era with a visit to the Temple of Augustus & Livia and the Roman theatre

located in the centre of town. Also visit the Romanesque-Gothic Cathedral St Maurice.

Day 3 Vienne to Viviers.

Enjoy a leisurely day cruising on the Rhone. Join a lecture on board or relax on deck whilst watching the scenery pass by.

Day 4 Ardeche Gorges.

From our mooring in the sleepy town of Viviers, we will visit the Ardeche Gorges with its magnificent scenery, most notably the spectacular limestone cliffs and the Pont d'Arc, the largest natural

arch in Europe. Return to the ship for lunch and spend a relaxing afternoon on board sailing to Avignon.

Day 5 Avignon & Gardens of

Abbaye Saint-Andre. We will spend this morning in Avignon. Enclosed by Medieval walls, this great City of the Popes boasts a number of splendid museums, churches and palaces. Our guided tour will include the Palais des Papes, one of the wonders of Provence and the largest and most important Medieval Gothic buildings in Europe. We also visit

the Cathedral and famous Pont Benezet, a bridge that spans the Rhone between Villeneuve les Avignon and Avignon. After lunch on board, we will visit Abbaye Saint-Andre's beautiful gardens with its Florentine inspiration and excellent views of Avignon and the Rhone Valley. The Abbey is located atop the hill known as Mont Andaon and now lies within the impressive Saint Andre fortress.

Day 6 Chateau Val Joanis & Arles.

From our mooring in Arles we will drive to Chateau Val Joanis, situated north of Aix-en-Provence

and set in the southern part of the Rhone valley. Enjoy an introduction to the winery followed by a tour around the beautiful gardens which are built on three terraces and cut into a hillside overlooking the vineyards. The lower terrace is devoted to fruit trees, the middle terrace to flowers and ornamental plants and the upper terrace is the vegetable garden, mixing flowers to vegetables. The three terraces are linked under the long arbour which is covered with roses and trumpet vines. Return to the ship for lunch and enjoy a guided walking tour of Arles this afternoon. We will see the huge amphitheatre and the former cathedral of St Trophime, a Romanesque Basilica constructed in the 12th century. Sail during dinner to Avignon.

Day 7 Uzès, Le Jardin Medieval & La Bambouseraie. This morning we visit historic Uzès, a gem of a town with a captivating history and some imposing and very beautiful buildings, including the castle of the Ducs d'Uzès. Visit the intimate Medieval Castle Garden set within its walls. This garden focuses on plants used during the Middle Ages for feeding, healing and many other uses in domestic life. We will enjoy lunch in a local restaurant before continuing to La Bambouseraie, a private botanical garden featuring exotic and rare plants, hundred-year old trees, giant bamboos and Victorian greenhouses. Return to the Amadeus Provence and enjoy our Farewell Drinks and Dinner tonight.

Day 8 Avignon to London. Disembark after breakfast and transfer to Marseille or Nice

airport for your return scheduled flight or travel by train to London St Pancras.

26th to 29th April 2018



After disembarking the Amadeus Provence in Avignon, we are offering the opportunity to join our three night post-cruise extension in Aix-en-Provence.

THE ITINERARY

Day 1 St Remy-de-Provence & Le Jardin de l'Alchimiste. Disembark this morning and enjoy a tour of St Remy de Provence. Nestled in the hills of Les Alpilles, the town centre is full of narrow

Medieval alleyways, fountains and squares. We will visit Saint Paul de Mausole where Vincent Van Gogh was interned for a year. It was here where he painted 150 canvasses, including "Olive Grove" and "Starry Night". After lunch in a local restaurant we will visit Le Jardin de l'Alchimiste. Later transfer to our hotel in Aix-en-Provence. The evening is free to dine independently.

Day 2 Aix-en-Provence & Sainte Victoire Mountain. On a guided walking tour this morning we will discover Aix-en-Provence with its leafy boulevards and public squares lined with 17th and 18th century mansions. Fountains hold an important place in the architecture here and the city is also known as the 'city of a thousand fountains', a name which it more than lives up to with its many beautiful and intricate marble sculpted fountains than can be found in nearly every square. After a visit to the Granet art museum and some free time for lunch, we will drive to Sainte Victoire Mountain, the subject of many of Paul Cezanne's paintings.

Day 3 Cassis. We depart this morning for Cassis where we will enjoy a boat trip through the Calanques National Park. Here long narrow deep fjord like inlets have cut into the limestone cliffs. Return to Aix-en-Provence for an afternoon and evening at leisure.

Day 4 Aix-en-Provence to London. Transfer to Marseille or Nice for our scheduled flight to London, or travel by train to London St Pancras.



WONDERS OF PROVENCE & BURGUNDY

Discover the cultural and natural splendours of the Rhone & Saone
26th April to 3rd May 2018

Exploring any country by river provides the traveller with an extra insight, understanding and lasting memory. This is particularly true of France where Mother Nature has provided the most perfect means of observing a great swathe of the country, from the vineyards of Burgundy to the beautiful landscapes of Provence. Our cruise along the Rhone, dubbed the 'River of Angels' by Robert Louis Stevenson and the narrow Saone offers a passage through history past great architectural treasures, through some truly wonderful scenery with time to appreciate the villages and towns and absorb the subtle changes in landscapes and lifestyles.

Our journey begins in Provence where we will explore the Medieval town of Avignon. For lovers of the natural world we will visit the Camargue Nature Park area, located south of Arles between the Mediterranean and the two arms of the Rhone River delta, where we can experience wildlife at its best, and the spectacular limestone cliffs of the Ardeche Gorges. Continuing north we will reach Lyon, the gastronomic capital of France, from where we sail through the rolling and beautiful hills of Burgundy for a visit to 17th century Chateau de la Chaize in Brouilly and Beaune with its cobbled streets. All this will be accomplished with ease from the comfort of the elegant Amadeus Provence.

THE ITINERARY

Day 1 London to Avignon, France.

Fly by scheduled flight to Nice or Marseille or travel by train from London St Pancras. Upon arrival, transfer to the Amadeus Provence and embark. Meet our fellow travellers this evening during Welcome Drinks and Dinner. Moor overnight in Avignon.

Day 2 Avignon, Pont du Gard & Uzès.

Enclosed by Medieval walls, Avignon, the great City of the Popes boasts a number of splendid museums, churches and palaces. Our guided walking tour will include the Palais des Papes, one of the wonders of Provence and the largest and

most important Medieval Gothic buildings in Europe, built in the 14th century as a fortified palace for the pontifical court. We also visit the cathedral and famous Pont Benezet, a bridge that spans the Rhone between Villeneuve les Avignon and Avignon. After lunch on board we will visit the Pont du Gard, one of the wonders of antiquity, built by Agrippa in 19BC. This imposing aqueduct-bridge was built by the Romans in order to provide the city of Nimes with fresh water from the Uzès area. The Memoires De Garrigue is situated on site at the Pont Du Gard, an open-air display designed to take the visitor on a journey through the history of Mediterranean agriculture and landscapes. Here we will find a great variety of plant life such as rock roses, honeysuckle, sarsaparilla and thyme. We continue our tour with a visit to the intimate Medieval Castle Garden set within its walls, the focus on which are the plants used during the Middle Ages for feeding, healing and many other uses in domestic life.

Day 3 The Camargue & Arles.

This morning we will drive to the Camargue, located south of Arles between the Mediterranean and the two arms of the Rhone river delta. The Camargue is home to more than 400 species of birds and its brine ponds provide one of the few European habitats for the greater flamingo. After our panoramic drive we will stop in the nearby picturesque fishing village



of Les Saintes-Maries-de-la-Mer to visit the local church famous for its gipsy pilgrimages. After lunch on board we will enjoy an afternoon guided walking tour of Arles to see the huge amphitheatre and the former cathedral of St Trophime, a Romanesque Basilica constructed in the 12th century.

Day 4 Ardeche Gorges.

From our mooring at Chateaufort du Rhone, we will visit the Ardeche Gorges with its magnificent scenery, most notably the spectacular limestone cliffs and the Pont d'Arc, the largest natural arch in Europe. Return to the ship for lunch and spend a relaxing afternoon sailing to Lyon.

Day 5 Lyon.

This morning will be spent exploring the gastronomic capital of France. During our guided tour we will travel up Fourviere Hill where we will see Vieux Lyon stretching along the right bank of the Saone, with its districts of St. Jean, St. Paul and St. Georges. St. Jean, with its beautiful houses of the Gothic, Renaissance and late 16th century period, is a splendid example of the glorious era which saw the city become one of the most important centres of trade and banking. Also included in our travels is Les Halles de Lyon, a fabulous gastronomic market. Sail north this afternoon to Chalon sur Saone.

Day 6 Beaune & Chateau de Cormatin. After breakfast, enjoy a scenic drive to Beaune where we will visit the 15th century Hospices de Beaune, with its remarkably decorated roof, gallery, kitchen and a well-preserved idea of how the beds would have looked in the Grand Salle des Malades. Beaune is a blend of cobbled streets, Medieval half-timbered houses, flowered squares and gardens. We will return to the vessel for lunch and this afternoon drive to Brancion, a tiny Medieval village, before continuing to the heart of southern Burgundy to the Chateau de Cormatin. Set in beautiful French gardens, the castle is undoubtedly one of the most sumptuous castles in Burgundy.

Day 7 Beaujolais & Cluny Abbey. Today we will drive into the charming, rolling countryside of Beaujolais and visit the family owned 17th century Chateau de la Chaize in Brouilly. The historic chateau is set in splendid gardens. There will be a chance to wander around before tasting a few Brouilly cuvees in the Chateau's magnificent cellars. After lunch on board we will visit Cluny Abbey, once the most powerful Benedictine Abbey of the West. Built in the Romanesque style, it was founded by William I, Duke of Aquitaine in 910. The Abbey was renowned for its strict adherence to the Rule of St Benedict and the place where the Benedictine Order was formed. Although most of the great Abbey of Cluny stands in ruins imagining it as it

once was is part of the attraction. Enjoy Farewell Drinks and Dinner this evening whilst sailing towards Lyon.

Day 8 Lyon to London. Disembark after breakfast and transfer to the airport for your return scheduled flight or travel by train to London St Pancras.



Enjoy wine tastings in some of the region's most popular wine-growing areas including Beaujolais where we visit the magnificent cellars of Chateau de le Chaize and in Cote Chalonnaise we will taste some wines at Chateau de Chamirey, one of the finest producers of Mercurey. We will also visit the famous Cave de Tain whose growers dominate the Hermitage appellation. Our onboard wine expert will be on hand to help us fully appreciate the flavours and history of France's glorious wines.

There is of course plenty more to enjoy than just wine including the 15th century Hospices de Beaune and the wonderfully preserved walled town of Viviers first established by the Romans. We will see further evidence of the region's Roman past in Vienne and spend time in Lyon, the gastronomic capital of France. Our days will be full of interest and enchanting scenery all made easily accessible by our wonderfully comfortable floating hotel.

Fly by scheduled flight or travel by train from London St Pancras. Upon arrival, transfer to the Amadeus Provence and embark. Meet our fellow travellers this evening during Welcome Drinks and Dinner. Set sail this evening to Macon.

Day 2 Beaujolais & Cluny Abbey.

Today we will drive into the charming, rolling countryside of Beaujolais and visit the family owned 17th century Chateau de la Chaize in Brouilly. The historic Chateau is set in splendid gardens. There will be a chance to wander around before tasting a few Brouilly cuvees in the Chateau's magnificent cellars. After lunch on board we will visit Cluny Abbey, once the most powerful Benedictine Abbey of the West. Built in the Romanesque style, it was founded by William I, Duke of



Aquitaine in 910. The Abbey was renowned for its strict adherence to the Rule of St Benedict and the place where the Benedictine Order was formed. Although most of the great Abbey of Cluny stands in ruins, the ruins still suggest the size and glory of the Abbey at its zenith, and imagining it as it once was is part of the attraction.

Day 3 Beaune and Cote

Chalonnaise. From our mooring at Chalon-sur-Saone we visit the world famous, 15th century Hospices de Beaune with its remarkably decorated roof, gallery, kitchen and a well-preserved idea of how the beds would have looked in the Grand Salle des Malades. Beaune is a blend of cobbled streets, Medieval half-timbered houses, flowered squares and gardens. After lunch on board we continue to Cote Chalonnaise where some of today's best value wine in Burgundy can be found. We will taste some wines at Chateau de Chamirey, probably the finest Mercurey producer. Sail this evening to Lyon.

During our guided tour we will travel up Fourviere Hill where we will see Vieux Lyon stretching along the right bank of the Saone, with its districts of St. Jean, St. Paul and St. Georges. This morning we will enjoy a wine tasting before continuing to Grignan. A charming hillside village, Grignan was made famous by Madame de Sevigne in her letters. Here we will visit a truffle farm where we will have the chance to taste some of these local delicacies. Continue to Chateau de Grignan. Originally built in the 11th century, it was transformed into a luxurious residence during the Renaissance. Rejoin the ship in Viviers, and after lunch enjoy a walking tour of this wonderfully preserved walled town first established by the Romans. Visit the Bishop's Palace, Cathedral and

La Maison des Chevaliers as well as enjoying the sweeping views over the Rhone valley at the top of the town.

Day 8 Ardeche Gorges. This morning we will visit the Ardeche Gorges with its magnificent scenery, most notably the spectacular limestone cliffs and the Pont d'Arc, the largest natural arch in Europe. Return to the ship for lunch and spend a relaxing afternoon sailing.

Day 9 Tournon and Hermitage. This morning we will be moored opposite the imposing hill of Hermitage covered with Syrah vines making some of the finest and most expensive red wines in the entire Rhone Valley.
