For those who enjoy cruising amongst some of the world's most beautiful coastal scenery, swimming in calm blue waters and discovering Medieval towns whilst accompanied by a small group of like-minded travellers, this unique itinerary from the Istrian coast all the way to Montenegro will surely appeal. We will sail through some truly beautiful scenery which you can appreciate whilst relaxing on the sun deck including cruising through the Brijuni Islands, the world-famous islets that make up the Kornati National Park and through the fjord-like entrance to Kotor. Other scenic attractions include a visit to the majestic waterfalls of Krka, strolling through the beautiful old towns of Hvar and Korcula and exploring the historic wonders of the World Heritage Sites of Dubrovnik and Kotor. This heady mix of islands and ports represents a fascinating itinerary combining as it does a mixture of renowned locations and under-the-radar gems.

With the Princess Eleganza as our base, we are able to visit some marvellous places which do not cater for the big ships such as the charming islands of Losinj and Pag with their quiet secluded bays, perfect spots for swim stops away from the crowds. We are also able to remain moored in the picturesque harbours when most vessels will have sailed from port enabling us to experience the atmospheric ports in their evening splendour and to dine ashore independently on many evenings.

Even the most jaded of travellers cannot fail to be won over by the unique beauty of this spectacular coastline. The sea is an intense blue and the islands are amazingly picturesque. Mountains sweep down to the sea covered in rich vegetation, islands lace the coast creating endless inviting waterways and channels and on shore there are great historic villages, towns and cities. This unique area has so much to offer the genuine traveller and our itinerary will be appreciated by those who enjoy a leisurely pace, an eclectic mix of places and an informal style of cruising.

Day 1 - London to Porec, Croatia.

Fly by scheduled indirect flight to Pula and transfer to the Princess Eleganza moored in Porec. After settling in to your cabin enjoy the Welcome Cocktail and Dinner on board.

Day 2 - Brijuni Islands & Pula.

We will sail this morning to the Brijuni Islands for a morning of exploration. The 14 islands of the Brijuni comprise one of Croatia's National Parks and were once the summer retreat of former Yugoslav leader, Tito. Between 1947 and 1980 he spent up to six months a year in the islands. On our morning excursion we will explore Veliki Brijun including the 1st century Roman Villa, the nine-hectare safari park created by Tito to house the exotic animals gifted to him by world leaders and the Church of St Germain. We will sail over lunch to Pula where on an afternoon tour we will discover one of the best preserved Roman amphitheatres in the world. The Arena, built in the 1st century AD was designed to host gladiatorial contests with seating for up to 20,000 spectators. Exploring the town further we will see the varied architecture from Baroque palaces, Christian churches and Austrian villas. Enjoy dinner on board tonight as we moor overnight.

Day 3 - Unije & Losinj.

Today we experience the benefits of our small ship as we call at two of the lesser visited islands of the area. We hope to stop this morning for a swim off the island of Unije before we arrive at the island of Losinj over lunch. This afternoon we will explore the picturesque town of Mali Losinj, often referred to as the prettiest port in the Adriatic with 19th century sea captain's houses lining the seafront and a charming historic quarter surrounded by green hills. Take the opportunity tonight to dine at one of the local restaurants.

Day 4 - Pag & Zadar.

This morning we cruise towards Zadar stopping at the island of Pag for a morning swim. Once a dominant city on the Adriatic coast rivalling Venice, Zadar is today a treasured city which has preserved its historical core. Enjoy an afternoon walking tour strolling around the old town with its Roman columns and portals, Romanesque churches and Renaissance and Baroque palaces. Of particular interest are the 9th century circular Church of St Donat, and the 13th century Romanesque cathedral. In the evening we have the chance to dine in one of the many restaurants in Zadar as we moor overnight.

Day 5 - Kornati Islands & Sibenik.

Spend the morning amongst the 140 islands that make up the Kornati archipelago, a wonder of natural beauty, coves and clear blue waters. George Bernard Shaw fell in love with the islands saying "On the last day of Creation God desired to crown His work, and thus created the Kornati islands out of tears, stars and breath." We will cruise around the islands and find a location to swim from the ship and in the afternoon continue to Sibenik. Here we will have time to explore the historic town including the Cathedral of St James, the old city walls, and the theatre before finding a restaurant to dine ashore.

Day 6 - Krka National Park & Hvar.

After breakfast on board we visit the majestic waterfalls of Krka on a guided walk along wooden walkways and across bridges through this unique fjord-like landscape with its multiple waterfalls and interesting flora and fauna. We return to the ship for lunch and spend the afternoon at sea as we cruise to Hvar arriving in the late afternoon. Take a brief walking tour of the Old Town of Hvar including the main

square, which is the largest piazza in Dalmatia, the cathedral, the Franciscan Monastery and the Benedictine Nunnery, where we hear about the aloe lace still produced today by the nuns. After some free time, return to the ship and enjoy dinner on board as we moor overnight.

Day 7 - Pakleni Islands & Korcula.

We will leave Hvar during breakfast and spend the morning at anchor in one of the private bays on the Pakleni Islands, a series of stunning wooded isles located off the coast of Hvar. Spend the morning swimming or enjoying the beautiful views. Over lunch we sail to Korcula, the reputed birthplace of the explorer Marco Polo, arriving in the late afternoon. Enjoy some free time to walk along Korcula’s crooked Medieval streets to the elegant squares which are flanked with palaces of the old nobility. Take the opportunity to dine independently in the Old Town as we moor overnight.

Day 8 - Dubrovnik.

We set sail in the early morning for Dubrovnik, the “Pearl of the Adriatic“, where we arrive after lunch. After a short drive to Pile Gate, enjoy an afternoon guided walk through the unique Medieval Old Town of Dubrovnik, which was added to the UNESCO World Heritage List in 1979. See the major attractions such as the Rector’s Palace, the Romanesque- Gothic Dominican and Franciscan Monasteries and the Sponza Palace. Return to the ship for dinner on board this evening.

Day 9 - Kotor, Montenegro.






Depart this morning for Montenegro and the town of Kotor, where we arrive in the early afternoon. Be on deck as we enter the Gulf of Kotor and sail up the fjord-like entrance to the Medieval town and UNESCO World Heritage Site of Kotor. Enjoy a guided walk through the town seeing the 12th century St Tryphon’s Cathedral and the ancient town gates. This evening we will have the Farewell dinner on board as we moor overnight.

Day 10 - Kotor to London.

Disembark this morning and transfer to the airport for the return scheduled flight to London.

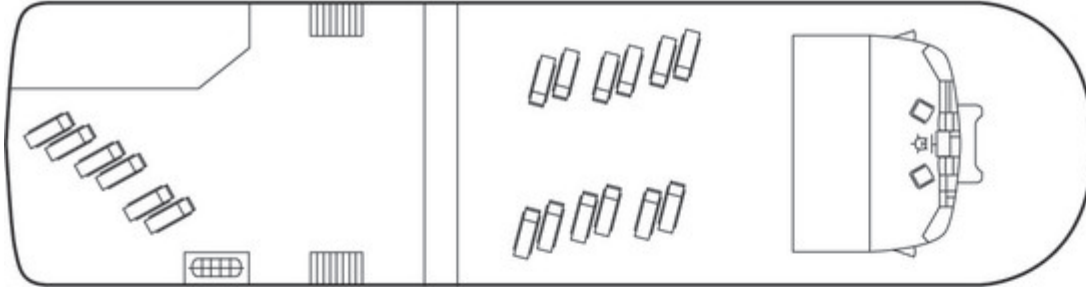

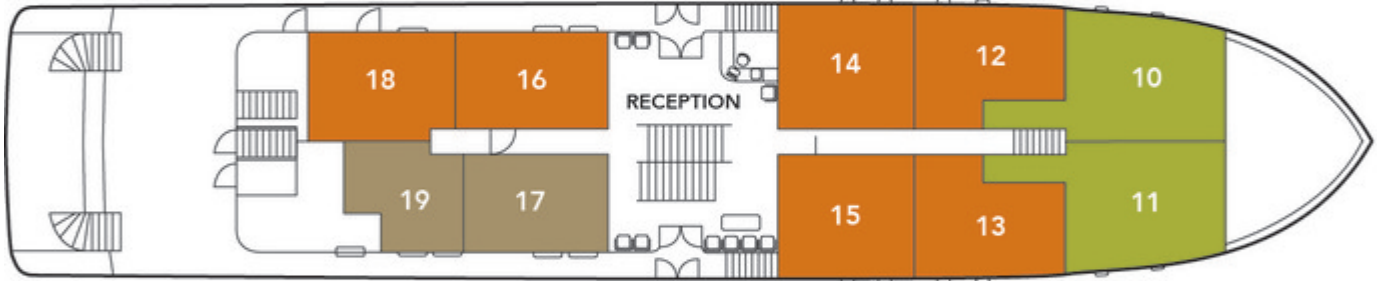

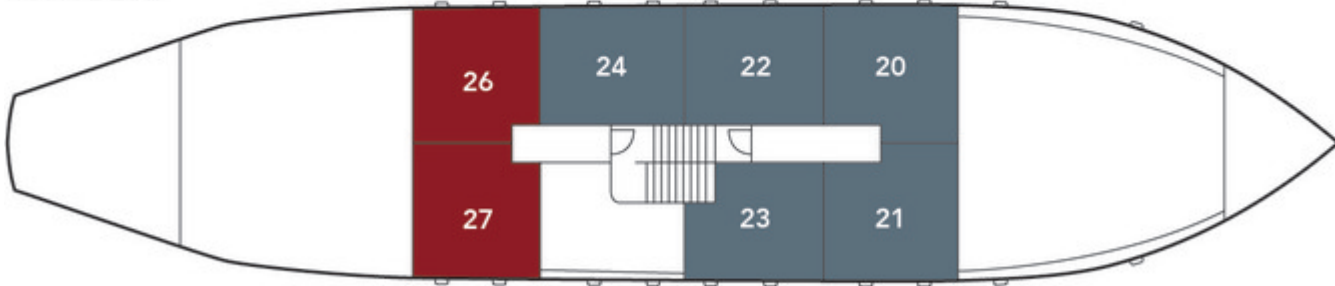

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Air-Conditioning

Every cabin is air-conditioned. The restaurant is also air-conditioned.

Alterations to the Schedule

Our planned schedule may have to be changed at short notice due to weather conditions, technical reasons or

decisions by the local harbour masters. Should there be any alterations the Captain or Cruise Director will inform you of any changes.

Cabins

The 19 cabins are equipped with air conditioning/heating, a wardrobe, drawers, a flat screen television, a hair-dryer and a safe. Most cabins also feature a dressing table and chair. Main Deck cabins have portholes, whilst Upper Deck cabins have small windows. The Promenade Deck cabins have larger picture windows which offer panoramic views. Cabins measure between 14 and 15 square metres, with the Master cabins on the Upper and Promenade Decks measuring 20 square metres. The two single cabins measure 12 square metres. The cabins have fixed beds and the configuration cannot be changed. An emergency call button is in all cabins. Each cabin also has an en-suite bathroom with shampoo / shower gel dispenser. Please note that the movement of the ship can cause small amounts of water to collect on your bathroom floor. Please note that bathrobes and slippers are not provided.

Cruise Director

Throughout your cruise you will be accompanied by your Noble Caledonia Cruise Director who will be happy to assist you with any queries or requests.

Daily Programme

A Daily Programme, detailing the following day's arrangements as well as any specific information about the day's activities is produced on board and delivered to your cabin each evening.

Dining, Drinking and Dietary Requirements

Meals on board are either buffet style or served to tables, in one sitting with an open seating arrangement. Usually all meals are served in the Dining Room but if you wish to enjoy your lunch or dinner in the outside area, please inform your Cruise Director that morning. Please keep in mind that during the summer months it can be very hot and/or windy. Fish and shellfish feature regularly on the lunch and dinner menus so if you do not, or cannot, eat these, please advise Noble Caledonia (in writing) in advance, and reconfirm with your Cruise Director on board.

Please be advised that as there is not a choice at meal times it is imperative that should you have any special dietary requests, you advise Noble Caledonia (in writing) in advance and we recommend that you also reconfirm with your Cruise Director once on board. Please advise if you do not eat red meat or are vegetarian, vegan, pescetarian, gluten free, lactose intolerant, low salt, or low cholesterol, as well as if you have any allergies/food intolerances. We regret that the ship is unable to guarantee special requests and is not equipped to prepare or serve kosher or halal cuisine.

Complimentary self-service tea and coffee, with fruit and biscuits, are available in the restaurant 24 hours a day. House wine, beer and soft drinks are included with lunch and dinner on board. Bar drinks and other beverages with meals are not included. On nights when you are free to dine independently ashore, if you instead wish to stay on board for dinner, this is possible at a rate of €25 per person each time, which will be added to your on-board account. 24 hours advance notice is required.

Disabled Facilities

The ship does not have facilities for disabled or wheelchair dependent passengers. The stairs between decks are

steep and there is no lift or chair lift on board.

Disembarkation

Your Cruise Director will provide you with disembarkation information prior to the end of your cruise.

Doctor

There is not a doctor on board. Should you be in need of medical assistance, please contact a member of the crew who are first aid trained, or your Cruise Director. In case of an emergency during the night please use the emergency call button in your cabin. Because the ship sails close to the shore, medical personnel can be summoned aboard quickly. Passengers requiring special medication are advised to bring a supply with them. Should you need to restock your medication, please advise your Cruise Director or a member of the crew as soon as possible as pharmacy opening hours in Croatia are restricted.

Dress Code

On board the emphasis is on comfortable and casual clothing at all times. The dress code is very informal. You may like to wear smart casual clothing for the welcome and farewell dinners, and when dining ashore. Please note that no ties or jackets for the gentlemen, and no formal dresses for the ladies are required.

Electricity

The cabins feature 220 volt current, with sockets accepting 2 round-pin (European style) sockets. There are no sockets in the bathrooms. We recommend taking a universal adaptor.

Emergencies

In the unlikely event of an emergency you will be informed by a loudspeaker announcement. We ask you to collect your life jacket from the cabin, proceed to the marked Muster Station on the Upper Deck and to follow instructions given by the Captain or crew members.

First Aid

We have an emergency first aid kit on board. If you require any item please contact your Cruise Director or a member of the crew. All crew are trained in First Aid.

Going Ashore

Passengers Ashore Tally Board: There is a tally board on the gangway. Please move the button from "IN" to "OUT" when you go ashore, and move it back on return. If only one passenger of a cabin of two is going out, please move the button into an intermediate position. Going Ashore Individually: When you go ashore individually, please be back on board at least 15 minutes before the advertised departure time of the ship. Please do not leave valuables in public areas, and please remember to lock your cabin. We kindly ask that you return to the ship no later than 23:00 after which the outside doors of the ship will be locked. If you plan to stay out longer, please let your Cruise Director know.
